CAD Report: Dean Evans reported on the January 27 meeting.

- Discussed a proposal to compensate faculty based on enrollment for teaching summer and winter courses
- The structure of course syllabi was discussed.
- Judy Byrd was recognized for her 39.5 years of service to WKU.
- Dr. Ransdell shared information related to budget and staffing
- Career and technical education was discussed.

CPE Metrics: Workday documents were reviewed and discussed. Dean Evans stressed that recruitment, retention, performance, and graduation rates will continue to matter.

Student Success: Dean Evans provided positive feedback from the recently attended Student Success Summit at WKU. He mentioned that several CEBS faculty delivered phenomenal presentations during the event.
