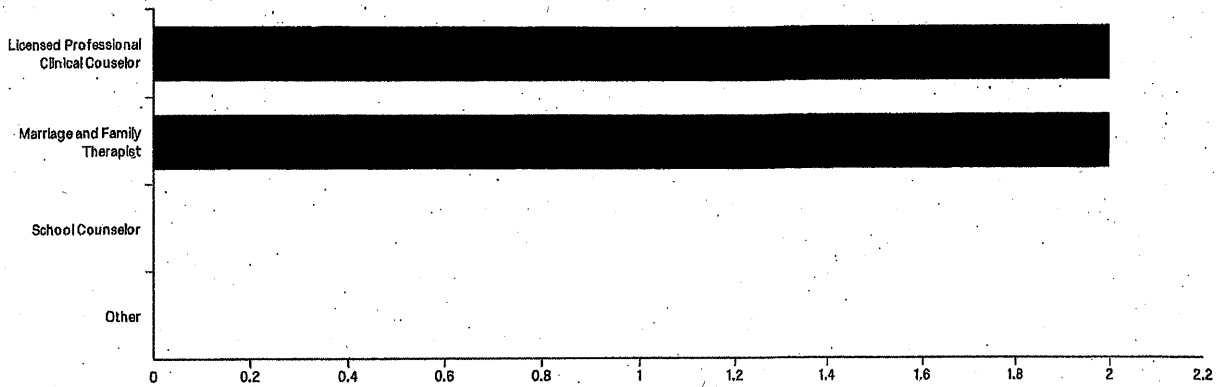

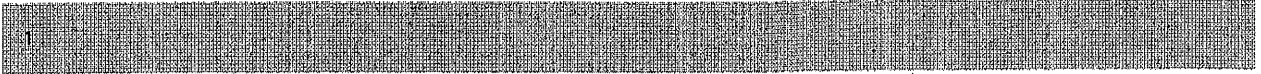

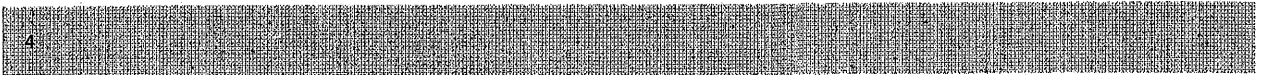
Q6 - How many WKU counseling graduates have you hired in the past 5 years?

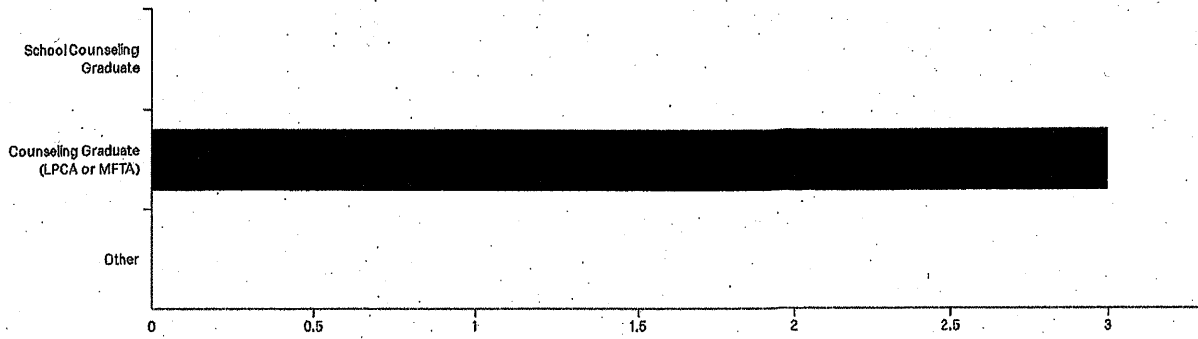

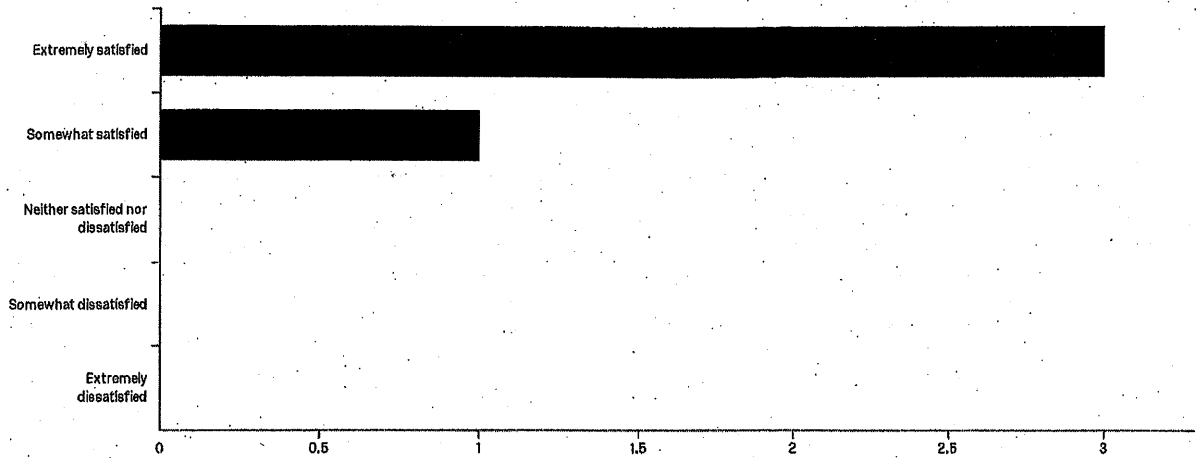

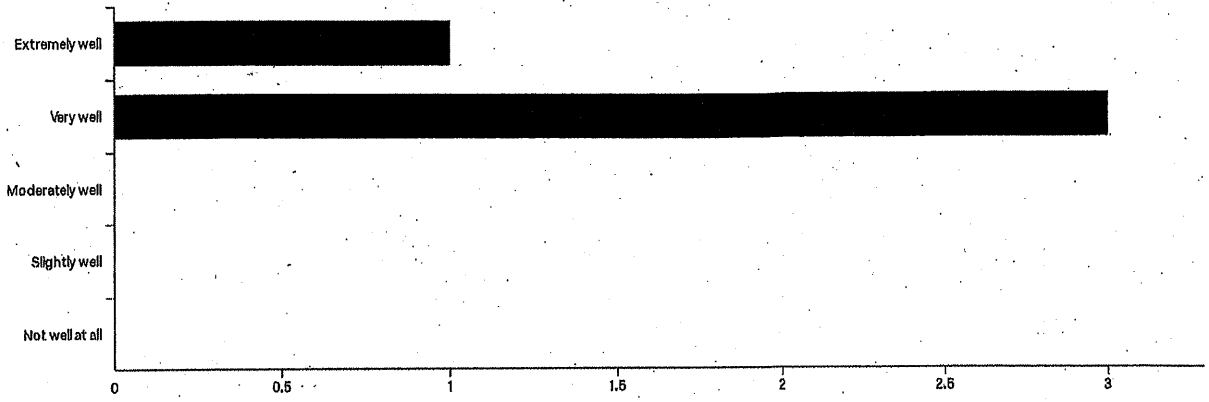
Q1 - How satisfied are you with the professional performance of WKU counseling interns and/or graduates?

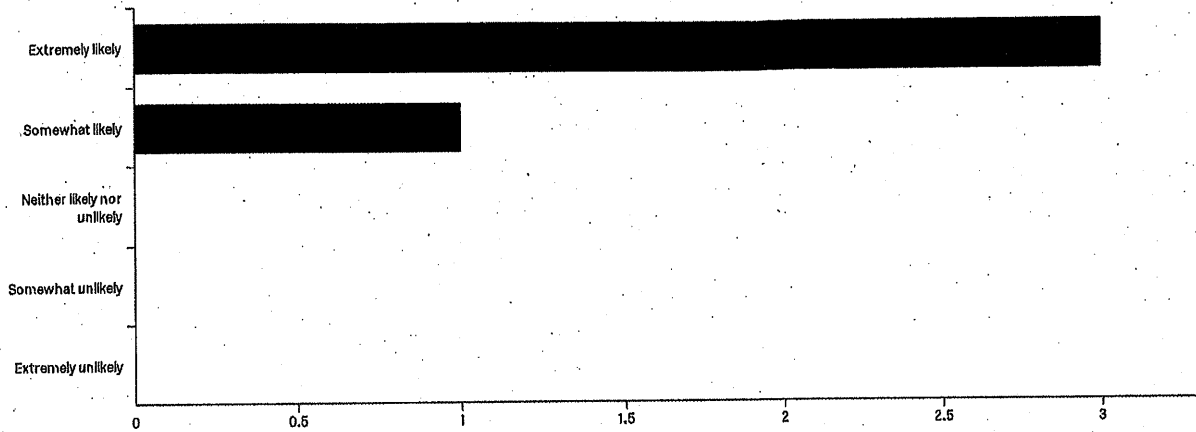
Q2 - How well do WKU counseling interns and/or graduates meet the expectations of your agency or school?
