WHO

The First Amendment guarantees freedoms concerning religion, expression, assembly, and the right to petition. It forbids Congress from both promoting one religion over others and also restricting an individual's religious practices.

WHAT

KRS 158.183 protects the expression of religious or political viewpoints in public postsecondary institutions.

WHERE

Anyone wishing to host an event on campus should contact WKU Campus and Community Events.

WHY

WKU is a learning environment offering students, faculty, and staff a chance to experience new ideas and cultures, to challenge their ways of thinking.
