-Students must earn a “C” or better in all **core classes** (Anth 120, 125, 130, 135, and 399).

-Two of the three classes required for the Archaeology Concentration (Anth 432 Field School in Archaeology and Anth 438 Archaeology Lab Methods) are offered in a limited rotation. Students must work closely with their advisor and pay attention to course offerings in order to schedule these classes when available.

-Students completing the archaeology concentration will probably have to take a summer school class in order to complete a mandatory archaeology field school experience (e.g. Anth 432).

Consult your advisor each semester

-World Language Proficiency: All students entering in Fall 2014 or later must demonstrate proficiency in a world language at the Novice High level before completing 60 credit hours. Novice high is the ability to communicate in writing and speaking on familiar topics in simple sentences.
