<sup>\*</sup> At least 50% (37 credit hours) of the BFA in Performing Arts must be in upper-division courses, numbered 300 or above.

<sup>\*</sup> BFA in Performing Arts students are expected to participate fully in the Jury/Portfolio Review (JPR) process and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5. Failure to do so may result in the student being placed on departmental probation. The full policy can be found in the appropriate concentration handbook
