Admission to the Gordon Ford College of Business and the Economics Program – To gain admission to the Gordon Ford College of Business (GFCB) and the Economics program students must have 60 earned hours with a minimum 2.0 overall GPA. They must also complete six admission courses (CIS 141; COMM 145; ECON 202, ECON 203, ECON 206; MATH 116 (or higher)) with a separately calculated 2.0 GPA.
