^{**}PE can be taken as 2 1-credit classes in different semesters or 1 3-credit class.

^{***}The regular course rotation for German foresees 2 upper level offerings per semester. A student who starts at 101 and does not study abroad will need 3 courses per semester for 3 semesters. GERM 389 or GER 455 are options above the 2 upper level offerings per semester. A full semester abroad, which will help future teachers develop "Advanced" proficiency, is strongly recommended and will avoid the 3-German-courses-per-semester issue.
