Things to Know About Your Financial Aid



Complete a new FAFSA each academic year.

Verification is not optional.

You must submit a new FAFSA each academic year. The new application opens on Oct. 1. If you have already submitted a FAFSA, make sure that you have added the WKU School Code (002002). To add the school code, log in to your FAFSA at fafsa.gov, click "Make Corrections", go to "School Information", and then add our school code. Make sure to click SUBMIT and get a confirmation page.

If you have been selected for Verification, you cannot be awarded your financial aid until you have been verified. Visit KHEAAVerify.com in order to submit your documents and to complete the Verification process.



Make sure WKU receives your latest transcript.

WKU should be sent academic transcripts from all schools you have previously attended. To determine if you qualify for a Transfer Scholarship, we must have your latest transcripts to ensure your GPA is correct and to confirm any degrees that you have earned.



Check your TopperMail on a regular basis.

You should periodically check your TopperMail account for important notifications from the Department of Student Financial Assistance regarding vour financial aid.



There are 3 steps for taking out your student loans.

If you are a first-time loan borrower, then in addition to accepting your student loans on TopNet, you must also complete Entrance Counseling and e-sign your Master Promissory Note at Studentloans.gov.

If you need additional financial assistance, you may be able to apply for a private loan which is a nonfederal loan offered by a lender. Or, your parent might be able to apply for a Parent PLUS Loan at Studentloans.gov. For more information, visit wku.edu/financialaid.



Apply for a TOPDollar Scholarship by Feb. 1st.

In order to be considered for scholarships for the upcoming academic year, you must complete a TOPDollar Scholarship Application at wku.edu/topdollar. Priority consideration is given to applicants who have applied by February 1st each year.



Changing your class schedule may affect your financial aid eligibility.

Once the semester starts, you may want to check with a Financial Aid Counselor before dropping or adding any classes. Depending on a particular 🤡 academic and financial situation, changing vour class schedule could affect vour future financial aid eligibility.



Your grades matter.

Federal rules require that WKU monitor each student's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). This means that in order to keep your financial aid, as an undergraduate student, you must earn at least a 2.0 GPA (WKU/Overall) AND earn at least 67% of your Attempted Hours.



Let us know if you are taking classes at another school.

If you are a WKU student and are taking classes at both WKU and a visiting school, you will need to complete a Consortium Agreement in order to receive financial aid for the total number of credit hours being taken at both institutions. For more information, visit wku.edu/financialaid



We care about your privacy.
