WKU confers degrees to 1,009

WKU conferred degrees to 1,009 students Saturday (Dec. 13) during its 164th Commencement.

WKU awarded 86 associate's degrees, 722 baccalaureate, 197 master's and four recipients of the doctoral degree offered cooperatively by WKU and University of Louisville. About 800 students participated in the ceremony at Diddle Arena.

President Gary Ransdell told the new graduates that they've been part of a well-defined transformation as WKU becomes a leading American university with international reach. "All of you entered WKU with great expectations of us – and of yourself," Dr. Ransdell said. "As you leave this Hill, you take with you years of memories and experiences. Your life has been shaped by your WKU experience, and WKU has been shaped by your influence."

Kristina Schmucker of Franklin was recognized as the Ogden Foundation Scholar, the top academic award presented to one graduating baccalaureate degree senior who has demonstrated exceptional academic achievement and outstanding university and civic engagement.

Schmucker, who completed her undergraduate degree in health care administration in August with a 4.0 grade-point average, also was named scholar of the College of Health and Human Services. Her sister, Sharon, was one of the scholars in the Gordon Ford College of Business.
