

CHARLES SCOTT,

Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, to all to whom these presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE, that by virtue and in consideration of a certificate, number *one hundred and forty eight* granted by the County Court of *Logan in July 1801* agreeably to an act of assembly, for settling and improving the vacant lands of this Commonwealth, there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto *Richard Fells*

a certain tract or parcel of containing *two hundred* acres by survey bearing date the *twenty ninth* day of *May* one thousand eight hundred and *six* lying and being in the county of *Logan on Gasper River* and bounded as followeth

to wit: Beginning at three white oaks Beginning corner to his former survey three South Sixty three East one hundred and twenty five poles to a Black and double white oak three South seventy East sixty poles to two post oaks three North seventy East one hundred and thirty seven poles to a Black Oak and Post oak Henry Lees Military line three with his line North twenty three East one hundred poles to a post oak Black oak and hickory three North seventy seven West one hundred and eighty one poles to a stake South East corner to his former survey three with a line of the same South fifty eight West one hundred and eighty four poles to the Beginning

With its appurtenances; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the said tract or parcel of Land, with its appurtenances to the said *Richard Fells* and *his* heirs forever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said CHARLES SCOTT, Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky hath hereunto set his hand and caused the seal of the said commonwealth to be affixed at Frankfort, on the *twenty second* day of *January* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *ten* and of the commonwealth the eighteenth.
