What is the GMAT?

The GMAT is required for admission to the WKU M.B.A. program. The GMAT exam includes four parts:

Quantitative, Verbal, Integrated Reasoning, Analytical Writing Assessment. The objective of this test is to assess a student's qualifications for advanced study in business and management. Preparing for the GMAT
