The WKU UAC reviews all WKU Athletic Team Schedules for the number of class days missed due to team travel. The WKU UAC reviewed the following team schedules for the 2023-2024 season:

*WKU student-athletes have completed approximately 3,300 hours of community service *WKU athletics is sponsoring a student-athlete career fair on 2/26; 40 companies registered *Multiple WKU student-athletes participated in the Nashville Predators career day *WKU SAAC hosted a spring Mental Health Town Hall for WKU student-athletes *Announced April 24 TOPSYs event

*WKU athletic department is providing stoles for spring graduating student-athletes *Answered question pertaining to TOPSYs academic awards

At each UAC meeting, the WKU Associate Athletic Director for Compliance in the WKU Athletic Department is asked to review any relevant issues occurring since the previous UAC meeting. During the 2024 Spring meetings, WKU Associate Athletic Director for Compliance John McCammon reviewed and/or reported on the following:

*As a result of a lawsuit filed by the state of Ohio, NCAA transfer players are immediately eligible at new school with no restrictions on number of previous transfers (temporary until court establishes permanent rule)

*Dartmouth basketball players have been ruled to be employees of the college

* The SEC and Big 10 conferences have formed an advisory committee

*Two pieces of legislation expected to receive final NCAA approval include a) immediate eligibility for academically-eligible student-athlete transfers with no limit on number of transfers, and b) athletic departments allowed to have limited involvement with student-athletes in the NIL process

*Discussed recent NCAA concerns about prop bets involving NCAA games

- Enforcement of "academically-eligible" and "progress toward degree" NCAA requirements
- Likelihood of student-athlete transfers playing for different universities during the same season
- Employment status and possible unionization of student-athletes
