Bill 36-22-S. Funding for Hilltopper Hunt: Egging out Hunger for Kentucky Veterans Brigade (KVB).

WHEREAS: The organization opened their doors to the entire Bowling Green community regardless of military status in the aftermath of the December 2021 tornado outbreak, and

WHEREAS: KVB relies heavily on the donations and support of community members, and

WHEREAS: The Twenty-First Senate of the Western Kentucky Student Government Association passed a resolution to support veterans within the WKU community, and

WHEREAS: Hilltopper Hunt is both a donation drive/fundraiser for KVB and a senior capstone project for four public relations majors at WKU, and

WHEREAS: Members of SGA, WKU ROTC, WKU Marketing and Communications, and WKU Community and Campus Events have discussed Hilltopper Hunt with KVB representatives, and

WHEREAS: Allocated funds will be used to purchase event supplies like Easter eggs, baskets, candy, promotional materials, and other event resources.

THEREFORE: Be it resolved that the Student Government Association of Western Kentucky University will allocate \$500 to fund Hilltopper Hunt: Egging out Hunger for KVB.
