CAPITAL BUDGET

Introduction

Capital expenditures are expenditures that create assets with a multi-year life (i.e., assets that will last for more than one budget period). Capital projects are budgeted separately from the operating budget since the source of funding for capital projects is generally different from the source of funding for operating expenditures. For selected projects, there is a link between the operating budget and the capital budget. For example, the State or WKU may choose to finance capital projects, which results in a debt service or lease/purchase payment obligation in the operating budget. WKU cannot initiate any capital construction project in an amount that exceeds \$1,000,000 without prior approval of the Kentucky General Assembly. An exception is made for projects whereby greater than 50 percent of the cost is funded by <u>private gifts or federal funds</u>. However, these projects must be submitted to an interim committee of the General Assembly and the Council on Postsecondary Education for approval.

The Capital Budget includes legislatively-authorized capital projects that <u>will be under way next</u> <u>year or are currently under way</u> including the source of funding, estimated cost, and the status of each respective project.

Most of the following projects reflect scopes equal to legislative authorization; projects started at an amount less than the authorized amount are displayed at the intended scope.

- <u>Construct Parking Structure III</u> With current enrollment, WKU has an immediate need to provide an additional 500 parking spaces and will do so with a new parking structure located in the Creason Lot. This project began in July 2016 and is expected to be complete in September 2017.
- <u>Parking and Street Improvements, 2016-18</u> As needed, this project is intended to improve pedestrian, vehicular and bus traffic flow.
- <u>Purchase Property for Campus Expansion, 2016-18</u> This project will allow the University to purchase property surrounding the campus, as it becomes available, to accommodate growth and increased parking needs.

- <u>Renovate Foundation Building</u> This project consists of improvements and additions to the College Heights Foundation building. Improvements include transformation to a traditional style building, changing out tired unsustainable systems, envelope improvements, providing handicap accessibility, material upgrades, and improving interior efficiencies.
- <u>Renovate Garrett Conference Center Academic Space</u> A consultant selection process is underway to select the A/E design team to lead a major multi-phase/multiyear project to renovate and complete a potential addition to this facility.

- <u>Renovate Science Campus Phase IV</u> This project was approved and financed with state bonds. Thompson Complex North Wing was demolished in January 2015. Construction for the new Ogden Hall began in February 2016. Hardin Planetarium was renovated during the summer of 2016. Thompson Center Wing renovation is scheduled to begin in January 2018.
- <u>Miscellaneous Maintenance Pool, 2014-16</u> This project is intended for repair and maintenance of critical systems, as needed. Approximately \$1,571,000 has been committed to make repairs to the Raymond Cravens Library/Helm Library building envelope. Phase I and II have been completed and Phase III has been designed. As funds are available this project will be completed.
- <u>Replace Underground Infrastructure Steam/Electric</u> During the summer of 2016, Zacharias Hall, Meredith Hall, Pearce Ford Tower Food Court and Preston Center were connected to the 12,470 volt campus distribution system. During the summer of 2017, Grise Hall will be connected. During the summer of 2017, steam lines will be replaced under the service drive at Academic Complex and adjacent to Zacharias Hall.
