Definitions

Notes

The data in this report was extracted January 22, 2016. This was the last day of Winter Term 2016. We used this date as it compares to the dates of previous Winter Term. The actual census date for Winter Term was moved to the spring semester due to changes in financial aid regulations.



Winter 2016 Highlights

Enrollment

WKU experienced a decrease in Fall 2015 enrollment. This was the third decrease in Fall to Fall numbers. However, in Fall 2015, WKU eliminated the drop for non-payment process. There was no drop for non-payment for Winter 2016, which is one of the reasons there was such an increase overall. There were 2,239 students that took Winter 2016 classes. This was an 11% increase from Winter 2015. Course enrollment was 2,320, which was up nearly 10% from Winter 2015. The student credit hour production for 2016 was 6,715.

Campus Participation

There were 285 sections of 221 courses offered at the Bowling Green and Elizabethtown campuses, as well as online, through Study Abroad, and Study Away. The number of students taking Winter Term has grown 41% since 2006 when Winter Term began. All colleges participated in Winter Term 2016 including 170 faculty.

Study Away

Floodplain Management

Dr. Warren Campbell led a course in floodplain management, which took 18 students to the southern California coast, through Death Valley and into Las Vegas. Dr. Campbell says that teaching study away is very different from teaching in a classroom because students get to fully experience what they learn. He said that students "actually see the overflow spillways at Hoover Dam and see that you can float a battleship in there. They need to see something in concrete, rock and dirt to fully appreciate these important engineering concepts."

Sundance Film Festival

For the third year in a row, WKU Study Away provided students the opportunity to travel to Park City, Utah and attend the world-renown Sundance Film Festival. This year, 16 students attended.

Food, Culture, and Environment/Geography of Public Health in Hawaii

In 2016, 14 students traveled to Hawaii to study all aspects of the culture. Students also had the opportunity to do a helicopter ride, snorkel with dolphins, and visit historical sights such as Pearl Harbor.

Contemporary Performance Studies – New York City

New York City was also a popular location for WKU Study Away this Winter Term. WKU sent 17 students to the Big Apple to study Theatre Appreciation or Contemporary Performance.

There were 81 students that studied abroad during Winter Term 2016:


- 62 through WKU Faculty-led programs




Student Demographics


Gender Demographics




Age Demographics




Winter Term registration began on October 5, 2015. There was no drop for non-payment this year, so there is no significant dip as in previous years.





Faculty Stipend Data By College


Full-time faculty stipend rates remained the same in 2016. The stipend for a full-time faculty member was \$1,500 per credit hour or \$4,500 for a three credit-hour class.

Part-time faculty rates, which increased in 2011, also remained the same in 2016. The amount for a three-credit hour class in Winter Term for a part-time faculty member is as follows:



For Winter 2016, there were 50 stipends adjusted down due to low enrollment. The high enrollment incentive was \$200 per credit hour for any course with 31 or more students. Two instructors received the additional compensation for a high enrolled classes. Stipend data generated 1/22/16 and includes information from Regional campuses and Cohort programs. Fringe benefits are NOT included in these amounts.


Number of Stipends




